## TESTING STARTS NEXT WEEK - PLEASE HELP!

It is very important for your child to do their best on the test. Here are a couple things you can do to help them.

- Keep a positive attitude about tests.
- Mark test days on your calendar so you can give your child a pep talk that morning!
- Make sure your child gets enough sleep the night before the test.
- Ensure that your child eats a healthy breakfast. It is difficult to concentrate when you are hungry.
- Make sure your child gets up early enough so that he/she will be on time to school and won't feel rushed.

1st Round of State Testing is ELA (English Language Arts)
3rd Grade - Most important assessment for third graders because they must get a high enough score to be promoted to 4th grade.

April 9th = ELA Part 1 (grades 3 and 5)
April 10th = ELA Part 1 (grade 4)
April 11th = ELA Part 2 (grades 3 and 5)
April 12th = ELA Part 2 (grade 4)

Attendance Fact $=$ Poor attendance can influence whether children read proficiently by the end of 3rd grade or be held back.
