The Board of Education of the Groveport Madison School District Board met in a special session on Wednesday, August 24, 2022. The meeting was held at the Groveport Madison High School located at 4475 S. Hamilton Road, Groveport, Ohio 43125.

Call to Order

The Meeting was called to order by President, Chris M. Snyder at 7:00 P.M.

Pledge of Allegiance

Led by Board President and recited by attendees.

Roll Call

> Chris M. Snyder read statement prepared by Vice-President, LaToya Dowdell-Burger, offering regret for her absence due to business travel and expressed her sincere appreciation for our first responders.

Police and Fire Updated Report

- ➤ James Grube, Superintendent, explained this report is to discuss the incident that took place on the evening of Friday, August 19th.
- Incident Commander, Josh Short, introduced by Groveport Police Chief, Casey Adams, presented a timeline and brief description of the events. Officer Short was unable to answer questions at this time due to the pending investigation.
 - o Prior to the incident police broke up multiple fights and aggravated gatherings.
 - o At 9:08 P.M. officers heard shots fired.
 - o At 9:12 P.M. officers found and apprehended Mr. James Keyes who fired a gun from the career center parking lot. Officers also shut down Hamilton Road.
 - o At 9:19 P.M. officers received a report of a shooter in the building.
 - o By 10:10 P.M. officers had cleared the building and found no evidence of a shooter in the building.
- Fire Chief Perry York reported on the response of medics to the event. Chief York noted that training allowing response to be swift and smooth. He further mentioned there were only minor injuries that needed tending.

Discuss Emerging Issues Surrounding Student Safety

- Paul Smathers, Deputy Superintendent, addressed the Board and those attending about the protocols for these events, including evacuation routes. Mr. Smathers noted he was pleased with the response and thankful that no one was seriously injured. Mr. Smathers detailed the actions which will be taken for the next football game, including no backpacks, increased officer presence, no entry after second quarter, and restricting tickers to GMHS and visiting team fans only.
- ➤ James Grube and Paul Smathers answered questions from the Board regarding details of actions to be taken. Mr. Grube reiterated that some safety plans are not so visible to the

public and must remain confidential. Mr. Grube noted that all students had access to support services when they returned to school on Monday to address any fears or trauma resulting from the incident.

- > Chris M. Snyder, President, detailed that he was in the parking lot when the incident took place. He was very pleased with the response from community members taking care of people and stepping up to do the right thing.
- ➤ Libby Gray expressed gratitude to the administrators and first responders. She also thanked members of the public who called 911 for their response.

Public Participation

➤ Harold McCary addressed the Board and those present about the culture of the school, especially the violence. Kenneth noted serious concerns about academic performance and student safety.

She also wondered if the Groveport student involved in one of the three fights would be allowed at future games. Ms. Walton also noted support of the no bags policy and extra police presence.
- > Groveport Madison High School Senior, Winnie Bosecker, addressed the Board and those present noting that lack of communication makes students question if they are safe. She also expressed fear of using restrooms due to fights in the bathroom.
