During direct instruction many teachers have the kids pin the teacher so all they see is the teacher but everyone can still hear what is happening when the student unmutes to answer questions. I bring this up because we have had music or adult conversations with profanity and the entire class has heard the inappropriate language. Please try to remember all background talking, music, sounds can be heard when your child is unmuted.

Also, just a reminder about attendance please call the school if your child is going to be absent or call us back after you get the message. It is much better to have an excused absence than a truancy absence entered.



Evening Meal Service *

Free meals also will be offered on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 4:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m., at Groveport Madison H.S., 4475 S. Hamilton Rd., Groveport.

* All Grab & Go Meals are served outside of the school building or the neighborhood location. Look for yellow "Grab & Go Meal" signs or our Groveport Madison School bus indicating the meals' actual distribution location.

Each Monday, students will get two days of breakfast and lunch, and on Wednesdays, students will get three days of breakfast and lunch. On Friday evenings, students will get two days of breakfast and lunch.

All meals are paid for by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and are free to youth 18 and younger through the end of the 2020-2021 school year.
