
Focus on Learning

In Mrs. Jahn's Kindergarten class, students have been working on the standard L.K.2 recognizing and naming end punctuation. Students reviewed the classroom chart of the three formats of

punctuation. As a group, they identified punctuation used in book excerpts that were presented on the smartboard. The class had to identify what type of punctuation they saw, by circling it with a specific colored marker from the smartboard.

As the students went back to their seats, they each were presented with a piece of paper that had sentence examples with punctuation. They independently identified and circled the punctuation using the same color crayons as they did during the whole group instruction. The students had so much fun learning about such interesting animals while focusing on punctuation! Did you know that a snail can have 25,000 teeth?









January PBIS Re-focus Kick-off

We started the 1st day back from break reminding students about our Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports. Teachers reviewed how to be a STAR in different common areas, benefits to being a STAR and consequences for choosing not to follow the rules.

Teachers also reminded students about the 2nd nine weeks reward. Here are the expectations for this nine weeks.

Friendly Reminders

Student Drop Off - Students should not be dropped off before 8:45 AM. We don't have supervision before this time and students will be outside in the cold temperatures. Also, the oval in the front is for the buses. All drop offs must be in front of the school by the fence or on the side of the school.


