Focus on Learning

There are many standards that fit this project but two that are specific to the social issues:

- 3PR Experiment with various ideas and visual art media to solve a problem that addresses a contemporary social issue.
- 4RE Communicate how personal artistic decisions are influenced by social, environmental and political views.

Our 5th graders did an amazing job on their posters and during the silent stance last Friday from 10:10-10:20. We also invited some students from the middle school and we were pleased with the respect they showed to our students.







February is Black History Month

Our staff and students have been celebrating Black History Month in a variety of different ways. Here are some examples:

Kindergarten - Teacher-led reading of biographies of the many contributions Black Americans have made to civil rights, science, the arts, and American history. Mrs. LaCass' kindergarten class has a differentiated writing center set up all month, and they're using different comprehension and writing activities to respond to each biography they read.

1st Grade - Reading "Brave, Black, First," about the first 50 African American women who changed the world and are researching Mae Jemison and then writing an informative summary.

2nd Grade - Biographies for research that will be presented on a Google slideshow to the class.

3rd Grade – Black History slideshow highlighting one African American person each day who has made a change or is influential for America. There are videos and/or read-alouds for each.

4th Grade – Black History Month Google slide project where students pick three African Americans to study their lives and achievements. Students pick one of the people to present to the class.

5th Grade - Learning about peaceful protesting. Students are talking about topics going on in our world today.
